## ITINERARY

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### Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check in from 4pm onwards.

Enjoy a complimentary Afternoon Tea on arrival.

### Day 2: North From Tissington

#### Option 1 - Tissington Village And Trail

**Distance:** 7½ miles (12km)

**Ascent:** 800 feet (240m)

**In summary:** We walk to the feudal village of Tissington on grassland and along the tree lined avenue. After exploring the village we make our way onto the Tissington Trail to the former Alsop en le Dale station before returning to the country house.

**Highlight:** The charming estate village of Tissington, home of the FitzHerbert family for over 500 years.

#### Option 2 - Tissington And Alsop En Le Dale

**Distance:** 10½ miles (17km)

**Ascent:** 1,200 feet (380m)

**In summary:** After visiting beautiful Tissington village our walk descends to Parwich and then ascends to reach the Tissington trail which we follow to Alsop en le Dale station before heading back to the country house.

**Highlight:** The famous Tissington Trail follows the route of the former London and North Western railway.

### Option 3 - Tissington, Parwich And Milldale

**Distance:** 12½ miles (20km)

**Ascent:** 1,550 feet (480m)

**In summary:** We begin following the route of option 2 to the Tissington Trail, taking in the estate village of Tissington. We then descend to the River Dove which we follow through a quiet dale to reach Milldale. From here the walk ascends to meet a farm track which we follow back to the house.

**Highlight:** Quaint Tissington village and all its history is not to be missed.

## Day 3: Villages, Brooks And Rivers And Tissington Trail

### Option 1 - Along The Lower Dove

**Distance:** 5½ miles (9km)

**Ascent:** 550 feet (180m)

**In Summary:** From the house, we walk through Thorpe village before descending to the River Dove at Coldwall Bridge. We take the riverside path on the far side in Staffordshire and follow this south to cross Okeover Bridge, site of the annual bridge jump. We then return on the Derbyshire side of the river to return to Thorpe.

**Highlight:** A delightful riverside walk along lower Dove.

### Option 2 - Tissington And Fenny Bentley

**Distance:** 10½ miles (16.5km)

**Ascent:** 1050 feet (320m)

**In Summary:** Following the Limestone Way to the estate village of Tissington, famous for its well dressings, we then take a delightful lane east with splendid views over surrounding hills and valleys. Walking south we descend Bentley Brook before turning west on undulating paths, skirting the village of Fenny Bentley eventually reaching the Tissington Trail. We follow the trail and paths north back to the country house.

**Highlight:** Fantastic views of Thorpe Cloud, 'the mini Matterhorn' from the Tissington Trail.

### Option 3 - Villages, Brooks And Rivers

**Distance:** 11½ miles (18.5km)

**Ascent:** 1,100 feet (340m)

**In Summary:** From Thorpe, this walk takes paths south towards Mappleton before heading north on the Tissington Trail. We then skirt the village of Fenny Bentley before following undulating paths towards Kniveton. The route descends to cross Bentley Brook before returning to Tissington using attractive gated road and paths, then taking the Limestone Way back to the country house.

**Highlight:** St Leonard's church, with its squat Norman tower, dating from 1150.

## Day 4: Ilam And The Manifold Valley

### Option 1 - Ilam Park

**Distance:** 8 miles (12.5km)

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**Ascent:** 1,300 feet (400m)

**In Summary:** The walk begins with a descent to cross the River Dove and then across fields to reach lofty Castern Hall. From here we follow the route of the Manifold into Ilam Park before ascending to the hamlet of Blore and follow the Limestone Way on our return to the country house.

**Highlight:** Beautiful Ilam Park with its Hall, church and gardens. We can see the River Manifold as it emerges from its underground route.

### Option 2 - Ilam And Blore

**Distance:** 9½ miles (15km)

**Ascent:** 1350 feet (420m)

**In Summary:** The walk starts in the village of Wetton, crossing fields to reach the lofty Castern Hall. From here we follow the route of the Manifold into Ilam Park before ascending to the hamlet of Blore and follow the Limestone Way on our return to the country house.

**Highlight:** Beautiful Ilam Park with its Hall, church and gardens. We can see the River Manifold as it emerges from its underground route.

### Option 3 - Ilam And The Manifold Way

**Distance:** 12½ miles (20km)

**Ascent:** 1,900 feet (600m)

**In Summary:** The walk skirts Wetton Hill before descending along the route of the Manifold River into Ilam Park. From here we have a gradual ascent to the hamlet of Blore and follow the Limestone Way on our return to the country house.

**Highlight:** Enjoy the panorama from Blore church over the limestone plateau and Dove Dale, with the shapely peak of Thorpe Cloud guarding the entrance.

## Day 5: Departure Day

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

## ACCOMMODATION

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### The Peveril Of The Peak

For those easily seduced by the charm of the Peak District, this characterful country house is a dealbreaker. Set in the tiny village of Thorpe, you'll be less than a mile from the famous Dovedale Stepping Stones – a series of 16 limestone-capped stones that were laid out in the 19th century to allow for a safe crossing over the River Dove. There's plenty of big-name attractions nearby, most fabulously the Twelve Apostles that is best viewed from the limestone promontory known as Lover's Leap. And there's no shortage of walking thrills, either, especially around the Roaches and the impressive Stanage Edge. Equally fabulous is the cone-shaped Thorpe Cloud, a limestone hill on the southern end of Dovedale and along the rolling green hills of the Staffordshire/ Derbyshire border. Named after Sir Walter Scott's 1923 novel, The Peveril of the Peak was most likely to have been built in the 1830s. By 1863, the Derby Mercury reported the transfer of an alehouse to Randel Williams and by 1871 it was owned by George Huggett. At the time, it was described as a 'hostelry recently enlarged and made attractive, not only by its position, but by the imitable capacity of the landlord'. Operating as a 'tourist house of good repute', it was later auctioned at the Grand Hotel Birmingham and used as a hotel thereafter. The cast and crew of Ridley Scott's 2010 blockbuster, Robin Hood, stayed here in 2009 while filming scenes at nearby Thorpe Pastures. Oscar-winning actor Russell Crowe has since cited the Peak District as one of his favourite places on the planet. Peveril of the Peak has been part of our HF Holidays line-up since 2012.

Nowadays, there's 46 well-appointed guest rooms in three categories (Classic, Premium, Superior). The house has a comfortable lounge with a wood burner for chilly days, a dining room for a wide range of dishes made with fresh and seasonal ingredients, a licenced bar, a large function room for dancing and activities, and books and games to borrow during your stay. You'll also find a boot and drying room, extensive grounds, plus an outdoor terrace that's perfect for soaking up beautiful countryside views. Elsewhere, the Discovery Point offers a wide range of local area maps, route guides, and easy-to-follow information for self-guided walks. There's a carpark with a footpath leading to the Dovedale Stepping Stones, too. But unless you're planning on driving to Chatsworth House or the villages of Bakewell and Castleton, you'll probably be happy just staying put.

Designed with your comfort in mind, The Peveril of the Peak has 46 well-appointed guest rooms available in three categories: Classic, Premium, and Superior.

**Classic Rooms** are comfortable en-suite guest rooms, ideal for a peaceful night's sleep. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, tea and coffee-making facilities, toiletries (hand wash, shampoo, and shower gel), and a 23-inch TV.

**Premium Rooms** are more spacious en-suite guest rooms offering upgraded views of the surrounds. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, tea and coffee-making facilities, toiletries (hand wash, shampoo, body lotion, shower gel, shower cap), and a 32-inch TV. Extras include bathrobes, slippers, and comfortable mattresses. Please note that an extra charge of £15 per person per night applies for this room type.

**Superior Rooms** are even more spacious en-suite guest rooms offering upgraded views of the surrounds. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, tea and coffee-making facilities, toiletries (hand wash, shampoo, body lotion, shower gel, shower cap), and a 32-inch TV. Extras include bathrobes, slippers, and comfortable mattresses. Please note that an extra charge of £25 per person per night applies for this room type.

**We love:** Room 2 on the ground floor for its extra space (it also has a door opening on to the grounds). Also lovely is the Chatsworth Room for its four-poster bed.

### A WARM WELCOME

### WALKS TALKS

Our HF Holidays Leaders host guided walking information briefings before and after dinner on arrival days. This is followed by a group Walks Talk for information on the following day's walking delights (usually held before and after dinner, so you can join whenever suits). Self-guided walking guests are, of course, welcome.

### THE WALKING DAY

Prior to setting off on walks, your HF Holidays Leader will run you through a short safety briefing. There's also an up-to-date weather forecast on display at the house to ensure you have appropriate clothing and footwear (we recommend anything waterproof enough to keep you dry in a sudden downpour). If you choose to do your own walks or are on a self-guided walking holiday, we ask that you please complete an Independent Walker Card each day. These can be found near the Discovery Point in the house.

Led by experienced chefs, we serve a wide range of dishes made with fresh and seasonal ingredients. We always aim to source the best produce available and use home-grown herbs and vegetables from our own gardens whenever possible. ### By Train:

The nearest railway stations to the Peveril of the Peak are Buxton or Derby. For train times and route planning by train visit [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) or phone [03457 48 49 50](tel:03457484950).

### By Taxi:

From Buxton railway station a taxi takes approximately 35 minutes for the 20-mile journey and costs around £42

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if pre-booked. From Derby railway station a taxi takes approximately 40 minutes for the 18-mile journey and costs around £32 if pre-booked. Please note these are 2022 guide prices for a 4-seat taxi. 8-seat taxis can be booked at a higher rate. A shared taxi will be arranged wherever possible. ## By Bus:

There is a bus service as far as Ashbourne, about 3 miles from our country house. From Buxton take the 442 service or from Derby catch the SW1 service. For bus times see [www.traveline.info](http://www.traveline.info)

From Ashbourne complete your journey by taxi, or use the Derbyshire Connect service tel: [01335 342951](tel:01335342951). By taxi the 3-mile journey will take approximately 10 minutes and will cost you around £8 for a 4-seat taxi from our recommended taxi provider (see above).

## By Car:

From the south leave the M1 at junction 24 and head to Ashbourne via the A50 and A515. Continue north on the A515 heading towards Buxton. 1 mile north of Ashbourne turn left, signposted to Thorpe, Dovedale and Ilam. After a further 2 miles the road bends sharply left by the Old Dog pub. The Peveril of the Peak lies ahead at the bottom of the hill. Look out for the sign.

From Buxton take the A515 south towards Ashbourne. After 17 miles turn right at a crossroads, following signs to Thorpe. After 1 mile turn right by the Old Dog pub. The Peveril of the Peak lies ahead at the bottom of the hill. Look out for the sign.

From the west leave the M6 at junction 15 and head via the A50, Cheadle (A521) and Oakamoor (A5417) to the A52. At the junction of the A52 and the A523 take the minor road signposted to Ilam. After 1½ miles turn left and descend the hill. Cross the bridge at Ilam, turn right and follow the road up a steep hill and onwards through Dovedale and Thorpe village. The Peveril of the Peak is on the left hand side at the end of the village.

## Travel From Overseas

Dovedale is located in the centre of the UK, with a number of airport options.

East Midlands Airport is about 30 miles away - this is served by short-haul European flights. If you're flying here, we'd recommend pre-booking a taxi direct to The Peveril of the Peak.

London Luton Airport has lots of low-cost European flights. From here take the shuttle bus to Luton Airport Parkway station, then on by train to Derby with 1 change at Leicester. Allow 1 hour 50 minutes to Derby - see [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) for train times. Complete your journey by taxi (see above).

Manchester Airport has a much wider range of long-haul flights. There are trains every hour from the airport to Buxton with one change at Manchester Piccadilly. Allow 1 hour 40 minutes to Buxton - see [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) for train times. Complete your journey by taxi (see above).

Flying to London Heathrow Airport is another option but has a longer onward train journey; allow 3 hours to reach Derby. From Heathrow first take the Piccadilly line Underground train to London St Pancras. From here take a train to direct to Derby - see [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) for train times. Complete your journey by taxi (see above).

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## LOCAL AREA

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The Peveril of the Peak occupies a wonderfully peaceful location in the village of Thorpe, and is surrounded by the rolling countryside of the Derbyshire Dales. The nearest facilities are in the small town of Ashbourne, about 3 miles away. Here you'll find a full range of shops plus supermarkets, banks, chemists, pubs and cafés.

During your stay you may enjoy visiting the following places of interest:

### Dovedale

One of the natural wonders of the Peak District, the spectacular limestone valley of Dovedale is less than 1 mile from The Peveril of the Peak – just follow the footpath signs from the car park.

### Chatsworth House

Home to the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire, [Chatsworth House](#) is one of Britain's most visited stately homes, which sits at the heart of a huge estate. Throughout the house there are fine displays of furniture, silver, tapestries, porcelain and paintings. The formal gardens cover 105 acres and include fountains, sculptures and a maze. Chatsworth is around 50 minutes' drive from The Peveril of the Peak.

### Crich Tramway Village

Located near the village of Crich, about 45 minutes' drive away, the [National Tramway Museum](#) has an impressive collection of vintage trams which run on a recreated historic street.

### Buxton

The Regency spa town of Buxton is about 19 miles from the Peveril of the Peak. Two key attractions are [Buxton Opera House](#) and [Poole's Cavern](#) show cave.

### Castleton

The popular village of Castleton is an excellent starting point for walks in the 'Dark Peak'; just under an hour's drive away. Nearby are four extensive show caves: [Peak Cavern](#), [Blue John Cavern](#), [Speedwell Cavern](#) and [Treak Cliff Cavern](#).

### Bakewell

Home to the famous 'Bakewell Pudding', this is one of the most attractive small towns in the national park. Bakewell is around 35 minutes' drive away.

### Alton Towers

The huge [Alton Towers](#) theme park is only 30 minutes' drive away and is a very popular option for families.

### Cromford Mills

[Cromford Mills](#) is the home of Sir Richard Arkwright's first mill complex, birthplace of the modern factory system and internationally recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This fascinating sites dates from 1771 and is about 35 minutes' drive away.

### Haddon Hall

A fortified medieval manor house, dating from the 12th century. [Haddon Hall](#) is located near Bakewell, about

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45 minutes' drive away.

## Tissington Trail

The [Tissington Trail](#) is just half a mile away from The Peveril of the Peak. This offers 13 miles of traffic-free cycling along a disused railway line and connects with the 17 mile High Peak Trail. Cycle hire is available nearby.

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## USEFUL HOLIDAY INFORMATION

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### Essential Information

*"There's no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong type of clothing!"* goes the adage. Come prepared for all eventualities and you'll walk in comfort as well as safety. Britain's famous for its changeable weather, so here's our advice on what to wear and bring.

#### Essentials

- Waterproof walking boots providing ankle support and good grip.
  - A waterproof jacket and over-trousers
  - Gloves and a warm hat (it can be chilly at any time of the year)
  - Rucksack
  - Water bottle (at least 1 litre capacity)
  - A small torch (everywhere in winter, year round in mountains)
  - Sun hat and sunscreen
- Denim jeans and waterproof capes are not suitable on any walks.*

#### Recommended

- Several layers of clothing, which can be added or removed
- Specialist walking socks to avoid blisters.
- A first aid kit inc plasters– your leader's first aid kit doesn't contain any medication
- Sit mat (insulated pad to sit on when you stop for a break)

#### You Might Also Want

- Walking poles, particularly useful for descents.
- Insect repellent
- Flask for hot drinks
- Rigid lunch box
- Gaiters
- Blister kit (eg Compeed) just in case
- Waterproof rucksack liner

## Safety On Your Holiday

Walks may be changed for safety reasons and are subject to a maximum and minimum number of guests.

Leaders always consider the safety of the group as a whole, and may need to alter or curtail the walk if the conditions dictate. Your leader may refuse to accept a guest while clothing, equipment or behaviour is unsuitable. In the event of a problem all leaders carry a mobile phone, first aid kit, group shelter, spare maps and a compass.

**Please note:** If you choose to leave the group your leader is no longer responsible for you.

If you have a particular health condition or disability please put this on your guest registration form. This information will be confidential to your leaders and the house manager, but leaders do need to take account

of any issues when planning walks. Please carry a copy of these trip notes with you, or note down the contact phone number for your accommodation (details in the travel section) should you need them in case of emergency.
