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## ITINERARY

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### Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check in from 4pm onwards.

### Day 2: Dales Of The River Dove

#### Option 1 - Dove Dale

Distance: 5½ miles (9km)

Ascent: 340 feet (100m)

**In Summary:** Descend from the village of Alstonfield to the hamlet of Milldale and its much photographed bridge over the River Dove. We follow the river through the famous gorge back to our Country House.

**Highlight:** Don't forget to look up to see the spectacular rock features of Dove Dale as you meander through the gorge.

#### Option 2 - Wolfescote Dale

Distance: 9 miles (14km)

Total ascent: 250 feet (80m)

**In Summary:** Descend through the limestone valley of Biggin Dale to meet the river Dove at Peaseland Rocks. We then follow the river downstream through the famous gorge to the stepping stones and our Country House.

**Highlight:** Biggin Dale is a National Nature Reserve. Look out for early purple orchids and rare cowslips.

### Option 3 - Along The Dove

Distance: 12 miles (19km)

Ascent: 450 feet (140m)

**In Summary:** Cross the fields to the charming village of Hartington. From here you follow the river through Beresford Dale, Wolfescote Dale and Dove Dale, with the scenery getting ever grander.

**Highlight:** Visit the fantastic cheese shop in Hartington to sample their locally made products. Our favourite is the sticky toffee cheddar!

## Day 3: Robin Hood's Stride

### Option 1 - Robin Hood's Stride & Bakewell

Distance: 7½ miles (12km)

Total ascent: 750 feet (240m)

**In Summary:** Visit the rock formations of Robin Hood's Stride and its hermit's cave, before continuing along the Limestone Way and the Bradford and Lathkill rivers before a ridge walk into Bakewell.

**Highlight:** When in Bakewell it would be rude not to sample the local delicacy - the Bakewell Pudding - enjoy!

### Option 2 - Through The Dales To Bakewell

Distance: 11 miles (18km)

Total ascent: 1,200 feet (360m)

**In Summary:** Cross the rolling limestone hills, taking in the 'Nine Ladies' stone circle and the rocks of Robin Hood's Stride. After following the river through Bradford Dale we'll cross the fields to Bakewell.

**Highlight:** The rocks of Robin Hood's Stride are also known as 'Mock Beggars Hall' - from a distance they could be mistaken for crumbling fortifications.

### Option 3 - Lathkill Dale And Monsal Head

Distance: 12½ miles (20km)

Total ascent: 1,550 feet (480m)

**In Summary:** Wander along Lathkill Dale; initially a dry valley, then beside the river. You will cross fields to visit the Magpie Mine and then descend Deep Dale to the Monsal Head viaduct, before heading to the village of Ashford-in-the-Water.

**Highlight:** Enjoy one of the Peak District's classic views over the old railway viaduct at Monsal Head.

## Day 4: The Plague Village Of Eyam And The Edges

### Option 1 - Eyam To Hathersage

**Distance:** 7½ miles (11.5km)

**Ascent:** 650 feet (200m)

**In Summary:** Explore Eyam village then walk to Stoney Middleton with its octagonal church. We then follow the River Derwent, with Froggatt Edge towering above us, past Padley Chapel to Hathersage.

**Highlight:** Discover the fascinating history of Eyam; noted for isolating itself to prevent the spread of a 17th Century plague.

### Option 2 - Eyam Moor

**Distance:** 9 miles (14.5km)

**Ascent:** 1,500 feet (460m)

**In Summary:** We have time to explore Eyam before a steady ascent up to Eyam Moor. After crossing dramatic moorland landscapes we ascend again to walk around Offerton Moors, and finally descend into Hathersage.

**Highlight:** Enjoy sweeping views over the green valley of the River Derwent, and over the gritstone hills of the Dark Peak.

### Option 3 - Gritstone Edges

**Distance:** 11½ miles (19km)

**Total ascent:** 1,550 feet (480m)

**In Summary:** A walk with two distinct sections. We first head along the Derwent Valley to Grindleford where we ascend onto the Iron Age hill fort of Carl Wark and the gritstone Stanage Edge.

**Highlight:** The gritstone escarpment of Stanage Edge is one of Britain's most popular sites for rock climbing - on a fine day you'll see numerous climbers scaling these gnarled cliffs.

## Day 5: The Manifold Valley And Ilam Park

### Option 1 - Ilam Park

**Distance:** 6 miles (10km)

**Ascent:** 750 feet (240m)

**In Summary:** Starting in the village of Wetton we walk high above the River Manifold to Castern Hall before descending to Ilam Park and village. We continue through the fields back to our Country House.

**Highlight:** We'll explore Ilam village with its grand hall, pseudo-alpine cottages and memorial cross.

### **Option 2 - Wetton To Ilam**

**Distance:** 8½ miles (13.5km)

**Total ascent:** 1,300 feet (380m)

**In Summary:** Walk above the Manifold Valley to Rushley Bridge from where we ascend to Blore with its Norman Church. We continue through the fields to Ilam Park, then head along the valley to our Country House.

**Highlight:** Look out for the disappearing river - the Manifold often flows underground between Wetton Mill and Ilam.

### **Option 3 - Along The Manifold**

**Distance:** 12 miles (19km)

**Ascent:** 2,150 feet (660m)

**In Summary:** Follow the Manifold Valley as it snakes through the rolling limestone hills. Our route takes us from Hulme End to our Country House via the villages of Wetton, Blore and Ilam.

**Highlight:** Enjoy the panorama from Blore church over the limestone plateau and Dove Dale, with the shapely peak of Thorpe Cloud guarding the entrance.

## **Day 6: Departure Day**

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

## **ACCOMMODATION**

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### **The Peveril Of The Peak**

The Peveril of the Peak, named after Sir Walter Scott's novel, stands proudly in the Peak District countryside, close to the village of Thorpe. Backed by the cone of Thorpe Cloud, which guards the entrance to Dovedale Gorge and the famous stepping stones at the entrance to the gorge, it's an ideal base for people hoping to explore the Derbyshire countryside. Surrounded by extensive grounds and rolling countryside, it's a picturesque retreat with 46 rooms, large shared spaces and a pleasant bar. Stride out from the house to find Dovedale's wooded ravine, cave-like Dove Holes and of course stepping stones. Upstream lie the heights nicknamed the Dovedale Castle and the Twelve Apostles, best viewed from the grassy spur called Lovers' Leap. While the Peak bit of the area name refers to small English hills rather than great summits, there's superb walking to be had on the Roaches and the gritstone escarpment of Stanage Edge, while Chatsworth, Tissington and Bakewell make attractive places to explore too.

### Need To Know

### Important Covid-19 Steps We Have Taken For Guest Safety: Please Read

As we slowly reopen in the wake of the Coronavirus lockdown, our country house stays are set to be organised a little differently; extra steps have been taken to keep our guests, house teams and leaders safe while we return to action. We ask all our guests to respect the measures put in place.

Initially the overall capacity of the houses has been reduced. Guests must wear face coverings in public spaces. To adhere to social distancing guidelines, we have taken the necessary steps to space out furniture and seating in public areas. In addition, a one-way system will be in place around the house. Adequate signage will be displayed to support the direction of travel to be followed by guests and house teams.

As a temporary measure, we will not be servicing rooms during a stay. Extra tea, coffee, milk, and toiletries will be made available on request for all guests. It is recommended that guests bring their own toiletries for the duration of their stay. We have removed all non-essential and reusable items from our rooms for the meantime including cushions, hairdryers, bathrobes, bed throws, and printed materials to reduce the number of items that need to be disinfected. Hairdryers will be available on request. Clean towels will be available on request. We will though be increasing the frequency of cleaning in our public areas providing particular attention to frequently touched items including door handles and handrails.

For now, there is no cream tea on arrival day. We have also adapted our food offering to remove all buffets and open food items. Different sittings may be required for breakfast and dinner due to the occupancy and size of the house. Picnic lunches will now be pre-ordered the night before from an order form in the room. The bar in each country house will be open, and we will be offering a table service for drinks. At this time there is no, or only a very limited, evening social programme available. Outdoor swimming pools at those houses that have them will re-open throughout August, except at Freshwater Bay House, where the pool will remain closed for 2020. Indoor swimming pools will remain closed.

### Rooms

*Tea & coffee-making facilities, TV, Hairdryer, Toiletries, Wi-Fi*

Stay in the smartly presented rooms in the main house. With 46 rooms, Peveril of the Peak has plenty of space and there's a range of Good and Better Rooms to choose from. Room 2 on the ground floor (accessible via 7 steps down from reception) is spacious and attractively styled with a door opening on to the grounds while the Chatsworth Room has a four-poster bed to recline on.

*All 'Good' rooms are ensuite and furnished to a high standard. There are also several 'Better' Rooms that are either larger or have a desirable view, a more luxurious mattress and larger televisions – upgrade your stay for just an extra £15-20 per person per night. You can choose a specific room for an extra £30 per room, subject to availability. Upgrade supplements still apply.*

### Facilities

*Free Wi-Fi, boot room and drying room, extensive garden, lounge, bar, ballroom, library and board games to borrow*

After a day delving into the Dovedale Gorge or exploring the Peak District, return to the house. Relax on the patio with a coffee or cold drink and soak up the wide-ranging countryside views. Take a turn through the garden and look out for the small canon on one of the lawns. Make your way inside to sit comfortably in the lounge where there's a stash of wood and a log burner for those colder days or snag a seat in the bar with your fellow guests and sip a great local ale by the large windows.

## Food & Drink

As at all our country houses, holidays are full board, from afternoon tea served as a welcome treat through that evening's meal to a hearty breakfast on the day of departure. Lunch is a chance to stock up on our famous picnic snacks. Food at Peveril of the Peak is varied and tasty and has a strong emphasis on ingredients from the area and seasonal produce. Once a week the dining room hosts a Local Food Night, when, over a sociable evening, you might try a five-course feast of regional flavours that might include venison sausage and Derbyshire oatcake, roast rump of Chatsworth lamb and a homemade Bakewell tart with a scoop of decadent Peak Dairy cherry Bakewell ice cream.

### By Rail:

The nearest railway stations are Buxton or Derby. For train times and route planning by train visit [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) or phone 03457 48 49 50.

### By Taxi:

From Buxton railway station a taxi takes approximately 45 minutes and costs around £42 if pre-booked. From Derby railway station a taxi takes approximately 40 minutes and costs around £32 if pre-booked. Please note these are 2020 prices relevant to a 4-seat taxi and should only be taken as a guide. 8-seat taxis can be booked at a higher rate. Ashbourne Taxis, our current recommended taxi company, can confirm prices on booking and will arrange shared taxis wherever possible. ### By Bus:

There is a bus service as far as Ashbourne, about 3 miles from our country house. From Buxton take the 442 service or from Derby catch the SW1 service. For bus times see [www.travelineeastmidlands.co.uk](http://www.travelineeastmidlands.co.uk)

From Ashbourne complete your journey by taxi, or use the Derbyshire Connect service (01335 342951). The taxi service must be pre-booked in advance by calling 01335 345198 the journey will take approximately 10 minutes and costs £8 for a 4-seat taxi.

## By Car:

From the south leave the M1 at junction 24 and head to Ashbourne via the A50 and A515. Continue north on the A515 heading towards Buxton. 1 mile north of Ashbourne turn left, signposted to Thorpe, Dovedale and Ilam. After a further 2 miles the road bends sharply left by the Old Dog pub. The Peveril of the Peak lies ahead at the bottom of the hill. Look out for the sign.

From Buxton take the A515 south towards Ashbourne. After 17 miles turn right at a crossroads, following signs to Thorpe. After 1 mile turn right by the Old Dog pub. The Peveril of the Peak lies ahead at the bottom of the hill. Look out for the sign.

From the west leave the M6 at junction 15 and head via the A50, Cheadle (A521) and Oakamoor (A5417) to the A52. At the junction of the A52 and the A523 take the minor road signposted to Ilam. After 1½ miles turn left and descend the hill. Cross the bridge at Ilam, turn right and follow the road up a steep hill and onwards through Dovedale and Thorpe village. The Peveril of the Peak is on the left hand side at the end of the village.

## Travel From Overseas

Dovedale is located in the centre of the UK, with a number of airport options.

East Midlands Airport is about 30 miles away - this is served by short-haul European flights. If you're flying here we'd recommend pre-booking a taxi direct to the Peveril of the Peak.

London Luton Airport has lots of low-cost European flights. From here take the shuttle bus to Luton Airport Parkway station, then on by train to Derby with 1 change at Leicester. Allow 1 hour 50 minutes to Derby - see [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) for train times. Complete your journey by taxi (see above).

Manchester Airport has a much wider range of long-haul flights. There are trains every hour from the airport to Buxton with one change at Manchester Piccadilly. Allow 1 hour 40 minutes to Buxton - see [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) for train times. Complete your journey by taxi (see above).

Flying to London Heathrow Airport is another option, but has a longer onward train journey - allow 3 hours to reach Derby. From Heathrow first take the Piccadilly line Underground train to London St Pancras. From here take a train to direct to Derby - see [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk) for train times. Complete your journey by taxi (see above).

## LOCAL AREA

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### Discover The Peak District

The Peveril of the Peak occupies a wonderfully peaceful location in the village of Thorpe, and is surrounded by the rolling countryside of the Derbyshire Dales.

The nearest facilities are in the small town of Ashbourne, about 3 miles away. Here you'll find a full range of shops plus supermarkets, banks, chemists, pubs and cafés.

During your stay you may enjoy visiting the following places of interest:

### Dove Dale

One of the natural wonders of the Peak District, the spectacular limestone valley of Dove Dale is less than 1 mile from The Peveril of the Peak – just follow the footpath signs from the car park.

### Chatsworth House And FountainChatsworth House

Home to the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire, Chatsworth House is one of Britain's most visited stately homes,

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which sits at the heart of a huge estate. Throughout the house there are fine displays of furniture, silver, tapestries, porcelain and paintings. The formal gardens cover 105 acres and include fountains, sculptures and a maze. Chatsworth is around 50 minutes' drive from The Peveril of the Peak. [www.chatsworth.org](http://www.chatsworth.org)

## Historic Tram Passing Under A Bridge - Crich Tramways Village

Located near the village of Crich, about 45 minutes' drive away, the National Tramway Museum has an impressive collection of vintage trams which run on a recreated historic street. [www.tramway.co.uk](http://www.tramway.co.uk)

## Buxton

The Regency spa town of Buxton is about 19 miles from the Peveril of the Peak. Two key attractions are the town's opera house, and Poole's Cavern show cave. [www.poolescavern.co.uk](http://www.poolescavern.co.uk) or [www.buxtonoperahouse.org.uk](http://www.buxtonoperahouse.org.uk)

## Castleton

The popular village of Castleton is an excellent starting point for walks in the 'Dark Peak'; just under an hour's drive away. Nearby are four extensive show caves: Peak Cavern, Blue John Cavern, Speedwell Cavern and Treak Cliff Cavern. [www.castleton.co.uk/caverns](http://www.castleton.co.uk/caverns)

### Bakewell

Home to the famous 'Bakewell Pudding', this is one of the most attractive small towns in the national park. Bakewell is around 35 minutes' drive away.

### Mine Train rollercoaster at Alton Towers

The huge Alton Towers theme park is only 30 minutes' drive away and is a very popular option for families. [www.altontowers.com](http://www.altontowers.com)

## Cromford Mill

This historic mill, dating from 1771, is a World Heritage Site, about 35 minutes' drive away. [www.cromfordmill.co.uk](http://www.cromfordmill.co.uk)

## Haddon Hall

A fortified medieval manor house, dating from the 12th century. Haddon Hall is located near Bakewell, about 45 minutes' drive away. [www.haddonhall.co.uk](http://www.haddonhall.co.uk)

## Tissington Trail

The Tissington Trail is just half a mile away from The Peveril of the Peak. This offers 13 miles of traffic-free cycling along a disused railway line and connects with the 17 mile High Peak Trail. Cycle hire is available nearby.

## USEFUL HOLIDAY INFORMATION

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### What To Bring

*"There's no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong type of clothing!"* goes the adage. Come prepared for all eventualities and you'll walk in comfort as well as safety. Britain's famous for its changeable weather, so here's our advice on what to wear and bring.

## Essentials

- Waterproof walking boots providing ankle support and good grip.
  - A waterproof jacket and over-trousers
  - Gloves and a warm hat (it can be chilly at any time of the year)
  - Rucksack
  - Water bottle (at least 1 litre capacity)
  - A small torch (everywhere in winter, year round in mountains)
  - Sun hat and sunscreen
- Denim jeans and waterproof capes are not suitable on any walks.*

## Recommended

- Several layers of clothing, which can be added or removed
- Specialist walking socks to avoid blisters.
- A first aid kit inc plasters– your leader's first aid kit doesn't contain any medication
- Sit mat (insulated pad to sit on when you stop for a break)

## You Might Also Want

- Walking poles, particularly useful for descents.
- Insect repellent
- Flask for hot drinks
- Rigid lunch box
- Gaiters
- Blister kit (eg Compeed) just in case
- Waterproof rucksack liner

## Safety On Your Holiday

Walks may be changed for safety reasons and are subject to a maximum and minimum number of guests. Leaders always consider the safety of the group as a whole, and may need to alter or curtail the walk if the conditions dictate. Your leader may refuse to accept a guest while clothing, equipment or behaviour is unsuitable. In the event of a problem all leaders carry a mobile phone, first aid kit, group shelter, spare maps and a compass.

Please note: If you choose to leave the group your leader is no longer responsible for you.

If you have a particular health condition or disability please put this on your guest registration form. This information will be confidential to your leaders and the house manager, but leaders do need to take account of any issues when planning walks.
