The huge rock amphitheatre of Malham Cove – once a waterfall to rival Niagara Falls – and the scenic cascades of Gordale Scar, are a snapshot of the wealth of natural wonders nearby. Whether you're seeking solitude and wilderness or the charm of cobbled streets in the quaint villages, the quiet homely beauty of the Yorkshire Dales will have you hooked.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check in from 4pm onwards.

Enjoy a complimentary Afternoon Tea on arrival.

Day 2: Winterburn

Option 1 - Calton & Winterburn

Distance: 7.5 miles (12km)

Ascent: 800 feet (260m)

In summary: This circular walk starts by going past Calton Hall, then exploring the hamlet of Calton. Tracks and fields paths lead to the hamlet of Winterburn. We return to Newfield Hall via field paths and lanes.

Highlights: Learn how the area has connections to Oliver Cromwell, with the fascinating history of Calton Hall.

Option 2 - Winterburn & Reservoir

Distance: 10 miles (16.5km)

Ascent: 1,000 feet (320m)

In summary: After ascending the road to Calton, we follow field paths to the head of Winterburn Reservoir. We cross tracks and fields then pass the hamlet of Winterburn and make our way back along lanes to Newfield Hall.

Highlight: Winterburn Reservoir was built to supply the canal with water and is now a good spot to see a range of birds.

Option 3 - Weets Top And Winterburn

Distance: 12 miles (19km)

Ascent: 1,400 feet (420m)

In summary: After passing through the hamlet of Calton, a steady climb leads over moorland to Weets Top. We then drop down over moor on the Dales High Way to Winterburn Reservoir passing near to the hamlet of Winterburn before continuing across field paths and on lanes to return to Newfield Hall.

Highlight: Superb views can be had of the Malham Mastiff as well as the surrounding area from the trig point at Weets Top.

Day 3: Free Day

Day 4: Haw Crag & Gargrave

Option 1 - The Pennine Way

Distance: 8 miles (12.5km)

Ascent: 750 feet (220m)

In Summary: This circular walk follows the Pennine Way south to Gargrave. From here we follow an old green lane to reach Haw Crag.

Highlight: An opportunity to climb Haw Crag (677 feet), which you can see from the house.

Option 2 - Gargrave & Haw Crag

Distance: 9.5 miles (15.5km)

Ascent: 850 feet (260m)

In summary: Our circular walk takes us south of Newfield Hall through undulating scenery to the village of Gargrave. We follow the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, before returning via an old Green Lane.

Highlight: A pleasant stroll by Eshton Beck and along the canal towpath where we will see Gargrave Locks.

Option 3 - Gargrave & Canal Locks

Distance: 13.5 miles (22km)

Ascent: 1,200 feet (380m)

In summary: This walk follows a similar route as option 2 and continues south west of Gargrave along the canal to Priest Holme Changeline Bridge, and then returning along the Pennine Way to Newfield Hall.

Highlight: An opportunity to view several locks on the Leeds-Liverpool Canal and enjoy great views to the north

of Gargrave.

Day 5: Malhamdale

Option 1 - Pennine Way To Malham

Distance: 7.5 miles (12.5km)

Ascent: 650 feet (200m)

In Summary: The country lanes to the village of Carlton before descending to the River Aire, following it through then beautiful valley of Malhamdale to reach the village of Malham. After exploring Malham return along the Pennine Way past the villages of Hanlith and Airton.

Highlight: Look for dippers in the River Aire and explore the popular village of Malham.

Option 2 - Malham Via The Pennine Way

Distance: 9.5 miles (15km)

Ascent: 900 feet (280m)

In Summary: Discover the beautiful countryside as we walk north by the River Aire through Malhamdale to reach the village of Malham. We take a circular route to view Malham Cove before returning along the Pennine Way past the villages of Hanlith and Airton.

Highlight: Walk past Aire Head Spring where the river resurges from underground and enjoy close-up views of the dramatic Malham Cove.

Option 3 - Malhamdale Classic

Distance: 12 miles (19.5km)

Ascent: 1600 feet (500m)

In Summary: We walk along the River Aire north enjoying stunning scenery of Malhamdale to arrive in Malham village. From here we take lanes and paths towards Malham Cove, and after exploring the limestone pavements atop the Cove, descend over moorland paths to visit Gordale Scar and Janet's Foss. We return south along the Pennine Way.

Highlight: Excellent views of Malham Cove and the opportunity to enjoy classic sights of the area, including Gordale Scar and Janet's Foss.

Day 6: Departure Day

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

ACCOMMODATION

Newfield Hall

Looking every inch the baronial mansion, Newfield Hall sits in two acres of grounds near the village of Malham at the southern base of Yorkshire Dales National Park. Given it was this very landscape which inspired Wordsworth to write a sonnet and Charles Kingsley to pen *The Water Babies*, the countryside views are as gorgeous as you'd imagine. You'll also have plenty of sightseeing greats within easy travelling distance, most notably Malham Tarn, Janet's Foss, Gordale Scar, and The Dry Valley of the Watlowes. And then, of course,

there's Malham Cove – the towering white limestone cliffs formed millions of years ago. Built in 1855 on land once belonging to the Lambert estate, the first resident of Newfield Hall was retired Skipton lawyer William Nicholson Alcock, whose father was a partner in founding the Craven Bank in 1791 (this later joined the Barclays family by way of Martins Bank in 1968). He moved in the following year, and this remained his home until his death in 1878. The estate then passed to his nephew, William, a captain in the Yorkshire Yeomanry, who immediately advertised for a tenant in the August 1878 edition of The Manchester Guardian. He described the house as 'a commodious family mansion' complete with grounds 'laid out with great taste'. It sparked little rental interest and the hall eventually sold to retired worsted spinner and manufacturer William Illingworth in 1890 and then to JW Morkil, future High Sheriff of the West Riding, in 1901. It has been part of our HF Holidays line-up since 1934 and has enjoyed a series of refurbishments over the years. Nowadays, there's 46 well-appointed guest rooms in three categories (Classic, Premium, and Superior) spread across the main building and the tastefully converted coach house. You'll find two cosy lounges, a licenced bar, books and games to borrow during your stay, and a light-filled dining room for a wide range of dishes made with fresh and seasonal ingredients. Elsewhere, there's a handy boot and drying room, a multi-purpose activity room used as an artist's studio and games room, plus a heated indoor pool overlooking the mature grounds that's open year-round. Many of the original design features remain, including the pillared entrance, impressive hall, and sweeping staircase. There's also a Discovery Point offering a wide range of local area maps, route guides, and easy-to-follow information for self-guided walks as well as a newly refreshed heritage room with displays of old HF Holidays brochures, photographs, walks programmes and other memorabilia.

Designed with your comfort in mind, Newfield Hall has 46 well-appointed guest rooms available in three categories: Classic, Premium, and Superior.

Classic Rooms are comfortable en-suite guest rooms, ideal for a peaceful night's sleep. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, tea and coffee-making facilities, toiletries (hand wash, shampoo, and shower gel), and a 23-inch TV.

Premium Rooms are more spacious en-suite guest rooms offering upgraded views of the surrounds. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, tea and coffee-making facilities, toiletries (hand wash, shampoo, body lotion, shower gel, shower cap), and a 32-inch TV. Extras include bathrobes, slippers, and comfortable mattresses. Please note that an extra charge of £15 per person per night applies for this room type.

Superior Rooms are even more spacious en-suite guest rooms offering upgraded views of the surrounds. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, tea and coffee-making facilities, toiletries (hand wash, shampoo, body lotion, shower gel, shower cap), and a 32-inch TV. Extras include bathrobes, slippers, and comfortable mattresses. Please note that an extra charge of £25 per person per night applies for this room type.

We love: The guest rooms spread across the main building and the tastefully converted coach house. Rooms 3 and 6 are both corner rooms offering original features and large bay windows overlooking the gardens and beyond (Room 6 has its own telescope).

WALKS TALKS

Our HF Holidays Leaders host guided walking information briefings before and after dinner on arrival days. This is followed by a group Walks Talk for information on the following day's walking delights (usually held before and after dinner, so you can join whenever suits). Self-guided walking guests are, of course, welcome.

THE WALKING DAY

Prior to setting off on walks, your HF Holidays Leader will run you through a short safety briefing. There's also an up-to-date weather forecast on display at the house to ensure you have appropriate clothing and footwear (we recommend anything waterproof enough to keep you dry in a sudden downpour). If you choose to do your own walks or are on a self-guided walking holiday, we ask that you please complete an Independent Walker Card each day. These can be found near the Discovery Point in the house.

Food & Drink

Led by experienced chefs, we serve a wide range of dishes made with fresh and seasonal ingredients. We always aim to source the best produce available and use home-grown herbs and vegetables from our own gardens whenever possible. By Train:

The most convenient railway station for Newfield Hall is at Skipton. Gargrave station is closer, but there is no taxi service from this station. For train times and route planning by train visit www.nationalrail.co.uk or phone [03457 48 49 50](tel:03457484950).

By Taxi:

The 8½ mile journey from Skipton to Newfield Hall takes approximately 25 minutes and can be made by taxi, pre-booked with our recommended taxi company, Station Taxis. As a guide price, it cost £18 per 4-seat taxi in 2022. 8-seat taxis are also available at a higher rate. Please pre-book your taxi at least 7 days in advance by contacting:

By Car:

From the south, follow the A65 from Skipton to Gargrave. Leave the A65 by Eshton Road, signposted to Malham and pass Eshton Hall on the right. Newfield Hall is approx. 2½ miles further on, on the right and before the village of Airton. Look out for our sign.

From the north, exit the M6 at junction 36 and take the A65 towards Skipton. In Coniston Cold village take a sharp left into a narrow road between houses, signposted to St Peters Church and Bell Busk and Malham. Pass under a railway viaduct, then after a mile bear right over a small bridge. After a further mile turn right at the junction, cross the narrow bridge then shortly after turn left through the gateway onto the drive of Newfield Hall. Look out for our sign.

There is free parking with the grounds of Newfield Hall.

Travelling From Overseas

There is a local airport at Leeds/Bradford served by some European flights. From here take the airport bus to Leeds station, then on by train to Skipton. Allow 1½ hours to Skipton - see www.transdevbus.co.uk for bus times and www.nationalrail.co.uk for train times.

Manchester Airport has a much wider range of long-haul flights. There are direct trains every hour from the airport to Skipton with one change at Leeds. Allow 2½ hours to Skipton. See www.nationalrail.co.uk for train times.

Flying to London Heathrow airport is another option but has a longer onward train journey; allow 4½ hours to reach Skipton. From Heathrow first take the Piccadilly line Underground train to London Kings Cross station. From here take a train to Skipton (1 change at Leeds) - see www.nationalrail.co.uk for train times. From Skipton you can complete the journey to Newfield Hall by taxi (see above).

LOCAL AREA

The Yorkshire Dales contains the quintessential landscape of Northern England. Enjoy the surrounding scenery of green patchwork fields, drystone walls and wild moorland hills.

Newfield Hall sits in rolling open countryside. The nearest village with facilities is Gargrave where there is a pub and shop. The market town of Skipton is about seven miles away. Here you'll find a full range of facilities including supermarkets, shops, banks, chemists, pubs and cafes.

During your visit to Newfield Hall you may enjoy visiting the following places of interest:

Malham Cove

Just 10 to 15 minutes' drive from Newfield Hall is the dramatic natural amphitheatre-like rock face of [Malham Cove](#), just one of the iconic limestone sights of the Yorkshire Dales. If you are not already visiting the cove as part of your holiday, it's well worth walking there along the Pennine Way from Newfield Hall (the walk takes around 1.5 hours in either direction).

Skipton

The market town of Skipton - about 20 minutes' drive from Newfield Hall - is a vibrant place to visit. Dominating the town is its well-preserved medieval [Skipton Castle](#).

Brontë Parsonage

Visit the [parsonage in Haworth](#), the home of authors Charlotte, Emily and Anne Brontë. Many of their most famous works were written here, including Jane Eyre, Wuthering Heights and the Tenant of Wildfell Hall. Haworth is around 45 minutes' drive from Newfield Hall.

Keighley And Worth Valley Railway

This [heritage steam railway](#) runs from the centre of Keighley to Oxenhope via the 'Brontë' village of Haworth. The line is still well-known as the setting for the 1970 film 'the Railway Children' and boasts an impressive selection of steam locomotives. Keighley station is around 35 minutes' drive from Newfield Hall.

Settle To Carlisle Railway

Ride [England's most scenic railway](#) through the Yorkshire Dales from Hellifield or Settle station. Heading north over the iconic Ribbleshead Viaduct you could head to the small market town of Appleby, or the border city of Carlisle.

Fountains Abbey

This impressive World Heritage Site contains the dramatic ruins of [Fountains Abbey](#), the largest monastic ruins in the country. There is an exhibition of life in the medieval Abbey. Adjacent to the abbey is Studley Royal water garden – England's most spectacular Georgian water garden. Both sites are managed by the National Trust.

White Scar Cave

Located near the village of Ingleton, about 40 minutes' drive from Newfield Hall, [White Scar](#) is Britain's longest show cave. The underground tour reveals spectacular caverns, waterfalls and stalactites.

Brimham Rocks

See the curious formations of [Brimham Rocks](#) above the valley of Nidderdale, around an hour's drive from Newfield Hall.

RHS Harlow Carr Garden

Situated near Harrogate, about 50 minutes' from Newfield Hall, are the Royal Horticultural Society's gardens at [Harlow Carr](#). The gardens have been planted to suit the challenging growing conditions of the north. Wander and enjoy the tranquil surroundings.

Harrogate

The spa town of Harrogate has fabulous shopping, fine cuisine and glorious gardens. Visit the [Turkish Baths & Health Spa](#), [Royal Pump Room Museum](#), the English Heritage Grade II listed [Valley Gardens](#) and [Betty's Tearooms](#).

Lightwater Valley

Set in 175 acres of parkland near Ripon, just over an hour's drive away, [Lightwater Valley](#) has big thrill rides including the 'Ultimate', the longest rollercoaster in Europe at 1.5 miles long. The park has over 40 rides and is fantastic fun for all the family.

York

One of Britain's most attractive historic cities, York is about a 1½ hours' drive from Newfield Hall. Attractions include the [York City Walls Trail](#), [York Minster](#), [National Railway Museum](#), and [Yorvik Viking Centre](#).

USEFUL HOLIDAY INFORMATION

Essential Information

"There's no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong type of clothing!" goes the adage. Come prepared for all eventualities and you'll walk in comfort as well as safety. Britain's famous for its changeable weather, so here's our advice on what to wear and bring.

Essentials

- Waterproof walking boots providing ankle support and good grip.
- A waterproof jacket and over-trousers
- Gloves and a warm hat (it can be chilly at any time of the year)
- Rucksack
- Water bottle (at least 1 litre capacity)
- A small torch (everywhere in winter, year round in mountains)
- Sun hat and sunscreen

Denim jeans and waterproof capes are not suitable on any walks.

Recommended

- Several layers of clothing, which can be added or removed
- Specialist walking socks to avoid blisters.
- A first aid kit inc plasters– your leader's first aid kit doesn't contain any medication
- Sit mat (insulated pad to sit on when you stop for a break)

You Might Also Want

- Walking poles, particularly useful for descents.
- Insect repellent
- Flask for hot drinks
- Rigid lunch box
- Gaiters
- Blister kit (eg Compeed) just in case
- Waterproof rucksack liner

Safety On Your Holiday

Walks may be changed for safety reasons and are subject to a maximum and minimum number of guests.

Leaders always consider the safety of the group as a whole, and may need to alter or curtail the walk if the conditions dictate. Your leader may refuse to accept a guest while clothing, equipment or behaviour is unsuitable. In the event of a problem all leaders carry a mobile phone, first aid kit, group shelter, spare maps and a compass.

Please note: If you choose to leave the group your leader is no longer responsible for you.

If you have a particular health condition or disability please put this on your guest registration form. This information will be confidential to your leaders and the house manager, but leaders do need to take account of any issues when planning walks. Please carry a copy of these trip notes with you, or note down the contact phone number for your accommodation (details in the travel section) should you need them in case of emergency.
