ITINERARY

Version 1 (Runs 2019/20)

Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check-in to your room from 2:30 p.m. onwards (upgraded rooms from 1 p.m.) Please join us for afternoon tea.

Day 2: South Purbeck Coast

Option 1 - Dancing Ledge

Distance: 6 miles (9½km)

Ascent: 800 feet (240m)

In Summary: Walk from the village of Langton Matravers to the coast at Dancing Ledge, a popular spot for rock climbers. From here we head east along the South West Coast Path to the Swanage.

Highlight: There's time to explore the traditional seaside resort of Swanage with its beach, pier and steam railway.

Option 2 - St Aldhelm's Head

Distance: 9½ miles (15km)

Ascent: 1,200 feet (400m)

In Summary: Walk from the picturesque village of Worth Matravers to the coast at St. Aldhelm's Head. From here the route follows the South West Coast Path, passing old quarries and Dancing Ledge to reach Swanage.

Highlight: With fine coastal walking throughout, there's much to enjoy on this stretch of the Jurassic Coast.

Option 3 - Chapman's Pool

Distance: 12 miles (19km)

Ascent: 1,800 feet (540m)

In Summary: This walk starts further west in the village of Kingston and goes south to join the coast at Houns-tout cliff. Our walk along the coastal path passes Chapman's Pool with some steep ascents and descents before rounding St Aldhelm's Head and continuing to Swanage.

Highlight: The horseshoe cove at Chapman's Pool; a tranquil haven beneath the towering cliffs.

Day 3: Lulworth Range Walks

Option 1 - Around Lulworth Cove

Distance: 6½ miles (10km)

Ascent: 1,050 feet (320m)

In Summary: Explore the landscapes around Lulworth Cove. We round the famous horseshoe cove and follow the coast into the military ranges, then head inland to West Lulworth, before a circuit of the chalk downs above the village.

Highlight: Discover the fascinating geology of Lulworth Cove, and how the sea has created this natural wonder.

Option 2 - Tyneham To Lulworth

Distance: 7 miles (11½km)

Ascent: 1,350 feet (420m)

In Summary: Descend from the chalk downs to the remains of the village of Tyneham. Our walk to Lulworth Cove has two steep ascents as we cross the high cliffs of the military ranges.

Highlight: The atmospheric, deserted village of Tyneham, requisitioned in 1943 to make way for the military training range.

Option 3 - Kimmeridge To Lulworth

Distance: 8½ miles (14km)

Ascent: 1,700 feet (520m)

In Summary: Follow the coastal path from Kimmeridge to Tyneham, then on over the dramatic cliffs of the military ranges back to Lulworth Cove.

Highlight: The coastline to the east of Lulworth Cove is particularly impressive. Expect some steep ascents and descents as you follow the undulating coastal path over the chalk cliffs.

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

Version 2 (Runs 2019/20)

Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check-in to your room from 2:30 p.m. onwards (upgraded rooms from 1 p.m.) Please join us for afternoon tea.

Day 2: South Purbeck Coast

Option 1 - Dancing Ledge

Distance: 6 miles (9½km)

Ascent: 800 feet (240m)

In Summary: Walk from the village of Langton Matravers to the coast at Dancing Ledge, a popular spot for rock climbers. From here we head east along the South West Coast Path to the Swanage.

Highlight: There's time to explore the traditional seaside resort of Swanage with its beach, pier and steam railway.

Option 2 - St Aldhelm's Head

Distance: 9½ miles (15km)

Ascent: 1,200 feet (400m)

In Summary: Walk from the picturesque village of Worth Matravers to the coast at St. Aldhelm's Head. From here the route follows the South West Coast Path, passing old quarries and Dancing Ledge to reach Swanage.

Highlight: With fine coastal walking throughout, there's much to enjoy on this stretch of the Jurassic Coast.

Option 3 - Chapman's Pool

Distance: 12 miles (19km)

Ascent: 1,800 feet (540m)

In Summary: This walk starts further west in the village of Kingston and goes south to join the coast at Houns-tout cliff. Our walk along the coastal path passes Chapman's Pool with some steep ascents and descents before rounding St Aldhelm's Head and continuing to Swanage.

Highlight: The horseshoe cove at Chapman's Pool; a tranquil haven beneath the towering cliffs.

Day 3: Durdle Door

Option 1 - Durdle Door

Distance: 7 miles (11km)

Ascent: 1,150 feet (360m)

In Summary: Start inland at the hamlet of West Chaldon and head south to the coast path above Ringstead Bay. Our route avoids the steepest sections of the cliff path as we continue to Durdle Door and Lulworth Cove.

Highlight: Admire the classic views of Durdle Door and Lulworth Cove as you follow the coastal path past these geological masterpieces.

Option 2 - Osmington To Lulworth

Distance: 7 miles (11½km)

Ascent: 1,300 feet (400m)

In Summary: A fabulous walk along the Dorset Coast Path from Osmington to Lulworth Cove. A highlight is the rollercoaster chalk cliffs - expect some steep ups and downs as you follow this dramatic section of coastline towards Durdle Door.

Highlight: The tiny church of St Catherine-by-the-Sea. Little bigger than a garden hut it occupies a glorious position atop the cliffs.

Option 3 - Weymouth To Lulworth

Distance: 10 miles (16km)

Ascent: 1,800 feet (540m)

In Summary: Follow this superb stretch of the Dorset Coast Path from Weymouth to Lulworth Cove. The cliffs steadily increase in grandeur as we pass Osmington Mills, then on over the rollercoaster cliffs to Durdle Door and Lulworth Cove.

Highlight: With fantastic sea views throughout, this is coastal walking at its very best.

Day 4: Departure Day

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

Version 3 (Runs 2019/20)

Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check-in to your room from 2:30 p.m. onwards (upgraded rooms from 1 p.m.) Please join us for afternoon tea.

Day 5: Swyre Head And On To Corfe Castle

Option 1 - Swyre Head & Corfe

Distance: 6½ miles (10.5km)

Ascent: 650 feet (200m)

In Summary: Walk from Kingston village south west to the viewpoint of Swyre Head. We then head inland to the village of Church Knowle then onto the chalk ridge which heads to the village of Corfe Castle.

Highlight: If we are very lucky we'll see all the way to Dartmoor from the superb viewpoint at Swyre Head.

Option 2 - Kimmeridge To Corfe Castle

Distance: 8 miles (13km)

Ascent: 950 feet (280m)

In Summary: Starting near Kimmeridge this walk heads east for the viewpoint at Swyre Head, the highest point of the Purbeck Hills. We make our way up to Church Knowle and finally walk the short chalk ridge eastwards to enjoy the village of Corfe Castle.

Highlight: If we are very lucky we'll see all the way to Dartmoor from the superb viewpoint at Swyre Head.

Option 3 - Kingston To Corfe Castle

Distance: 9 miles (14.5km)

Ascent: 1,020 feet (320m)

In summary: We will also start from Kingston, but we first head out towards Kimmeridge to take in Swyre Head and on to Steeple to take advantage of the views along Ridgeway Hill before descending to Corfe Castle.

Highlight: The impressive Ridgeway Hill from Steeple to Corfe castle.

Day 8: Around Lulworth

Option 1 - Above Lulworth

Distance: 6½ miles (10.5km)

Ascent: 1,100 feet (340m)

In Summary: Walking a circular route from Lulworth, today's walk heads above the village, before descending to the coast where we follow the South West Coast Path. We'll take soup and sandwiches on our walk today, with a delightful afternoon tea to look forward to on our return to West Lulworth House.

Highlight: The spectacular Durdle Door features in our walk today.

Option 2 - Dorset Coast Path

Distance: 9 miles (14.5km)

Ascent: 1,450 feet (440m)

In Summary: A fabulous circular walk visiting St Catherine's Church with its beautifully etched glass. We return following a high level route back descending to the coast at Durdle Door and on to Lulworth. We'll take soup and sandwiches on our walk today, with a delightful afternoon tea to look forward to on our return to West Lulworth House.

Highlight: Visit the tiny church of St Catherine's-by-the-Sea with its beautifully etched stained glass atop the cliffs.

Option 3 - Durdle Door

Distance: 10 miles (16km)

Ascent: 1,750 feet (540m)

In Summary: Again a fabulous circular walk above the coast visiting St Catherine's Church with its beautifully etched glass. Expect some steep ups and downs as you follow the rollercoaster chalk cliffs back towards Durdle Door and on to Lulworth Cove. We'll take soup and sandwiches on our walk today, with a delightful afternoon tea to look forward to on our return to West Lulworth House.

Highlight: The stunning and strenuous coastal walk along the 'Bottoms' and past Durdle Door.

Day 16: Departure Day

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

Version 4 (Runs 2019/20)

Day 1: Arrival Day

You're welcome to check-in to your room from 2:30 p.m. onwards (upgraded rooms from 1 p.m.) Please join us for afternoon tea.

Day 2: Agglestone And Studland

Option 1 - Agglestone Rock And Swanage

Distance: 5½ miles (9km)

Ascent: 550 feet (170m)

In Summary: Heading out over Studland Heath we pass the impressive Agglestone Rock before reaching the beach at beautiful Studland Bay. We then head up and over Ballard Down to finish in Swanage.

Highlight: Explore the traditional seaside resort of Swanage with it's beach pier and steam railway or simply relax with a coffee or a pint at the end of the walk.

Option 2 - Down The Coast To Studland

Distance: 7½ miles (12km)

Ascent: 700 feet (220m)

In Summary: This walk follows the same route as option 1 past the 400 tonne sandstone block at Agglestone and down to the coast Studland. Afterwards we take the coast path and take in Old Harry Rocks, we also finish in Swanage.

Highlight: Marvel at the magnificent chalk stacks of Old Harry Rocks at the start of the Jurassic Coast.

Option 3 - Corfe Castle To Swanage

Distance: 12½ miles (20km)

Ascent: 1,650 feet (500m)

In Summary: Enjoy a stunning variety of inland and coastal scenery. We begin in Corfe Castle and head towards the coast along the Purbeck Way. We leave the Purbeck Way to take in the village of Studland, before continuing along the coast to Swanage.

Highlight: Soak up the sea views from the famous chalk stacks of Old Harry Rocks, and gaze out towards the corresponding Needles Rocks on the Isle of Wight.

Distance: 6½ miles (10.5km)

Option 1 - Agglestone Rock And Swanage

Distance: 5½ miles (9km)

Ascent: 550 feet (170m)

In Summary: Heading out over Studland Heath we pass the impressive Agglestone Rock before reaching the beach at beautiful Studland Bay. We then head up and over Ballard Down to finish in Swanage.

Highlight: Explore the traditional seaside resort of Swanage with its beach pier and steam railway or simply relax with a coffee or a pint at the end of the walk.

Option 2 - Down The Coast To Studland

Distance: 7½ miles (12km)

Ascent: 700 feet (220m)

In Summary: This walk follows the same route as option 1 past the 400 tonne sandstone block at Agglestone and down to the coast Studland. Afterwards we take the coast path and take in Old Harry Rocks, we also finish in Swanage.

Highlight: Marvel at the magnificent chalk stacks of Old Harry Rocks at the start of the Jurassic Coast.

Option 3 - Corfe Castle To Swanage

Distance: 12½ miles (20km)

Ascent: 1,650 feet (500m)

Ascent: 1,350 feet (400m)

In Summary: This walk starts further along the coast on the military ranges, goes through the deserted village of Tyneham and follows the South West Coast Path back to Lulworth Cove.

Highlight: The atmospheric deserted village of Tyneham, requisitioned in 1943 to make way for the military training range.

Option 3 - Kimmeridge To Lulworth

Distance: 8½ miles (14km)

Ascent: 1,700 feet (520m)

In Summary: Follow the coastal path from Kimmeridge to Tyneham, then on over the dramatic cliffs of the

military ranges back to Lulworth Cove.

Highlight: The coastline to the east of Lulworth Cove is particularly impressive. Expect some steep ascents and descents as you follow the undulating coastal path over the chalk cliffs.

Day 4: Departure Day

ACCOMMODATION

West Lulworth House

Set just 200 yards from the sea, West Lulworth House has a highly coveted location just above the lake-still expanse of Lulworth Cove on Dorset's iconic Jurassic Coast. Built in 1881 by the then Mayor of Weymouth, it has been perennially popular with walkers, twitchers and fossil hunters. As well as 22 delightful bedrooms, there's a south facing garden and elevated terrace with cracking views, an outdoor heated pool and a pair of lovely lounges, perfect for a relaxing walking holiday exploring the Jurassic Coast. Step out the front door and on to the coast path. To the west lies Middle Beach and the picture perfect Durdle Door, with its massive rock arch and gently sloping beach. East lie the beaches of Mupe Bay and Arish Mell. But you're here for the walking and what adventure you'll have on the coast path or exploring the interior. Then there's Lulworth Castle and the famous ruins of Corfe Castle standing guard over the Purbeck Hills to explore.

Stay in one of the main building's bright, beautifully presented rooms or in the adjoining cottage. With 22 bedrooms, West Lulworth House has plenty of space and there's a range of Good, Better and Best Rooms to choose from: each room has an airy feel and the same cosy style. Opt though for Room 3 on the first floor of the main house for its weathered, pastel-painted wood panels and the lovely view looking over the cove, or squirrel yourself away in Room 22 in the cottage to the side of the main house for a large room with more sumptuous views to soak up.

All 'Good' rooms are ensuite and furnished to a high standard. There are also several 'Better' and 'Best' Rooms that are either larger or have a desirable view, a more luxurious mattress, larger television, enhanced toiletries and a fluffy bathrobe & slippers – upgrade your stay for just an extra £15-20 per person per night. You can choose a specific room for an extra £30 per room, subject to availability. Upgrade supplements still apply.

After a day walking on the Dorset Coast or hunting for fossils, come back to the house and its specially tailored walkers' facilities. Relax by sitting in the sunny south facing gardens or take a table on the terrace with matchless views of the cove below. Slip in to the heated outdoor pool then surface in time to retire to the cosy

lounge and its squishy sofas and seafaring decorations to read up on the area or the attractive bar with its pretty tiled insets for a sundowner.

Food & Drink

As at all our country houses, holidays are full board, from afternoon tea served as a welcome treat through that evening's meal to a hearty breakfast on the day of departure. Lunch is a chance to stock up on our famous picnic snacks. Food at West Lulworth House is hearty and has a strong emphasis on ingredients from the area and seasonal produce. Once a week the dining room hosts a Local Food Night, when, over a sociable evening, you might tuck in to flavours such as Dorset blue Vinney, pork fillet with Purbeck Cider and apple sauce and New Forest wild mushroom tagliatelle. Settle in under the large roof lantern or beside the panoramic double doors to dine in style – if the sun's out they'll even throw the doors open to let the outside in.

Travel Details

Our address is: West Lulworth House, Lulworth Cove, Dorset BH20 5RJ

We recommend getting the train to Wool and then a taxi transfer to West Lulworth House. However if you are planning on driving, please note that you can only park in a public car park. Please check the process below.

By Train:

The nearest railway station is at Wool. For train times and route planning by train visit www.nationalrail.co.uk or phone 03457 48 49 50.

By Taxi:

The 5 mile journey from Wool railway station takes approximately 15 minutes. Pre-booked taxis cost approx £13 per 4 seat taxi. The taxi company will arrange shared taxis wherever possible. Details of our current recommended taxi company and rates will be sent to you with your final dispatch documents, four weeks before departure. The return taxi journey can be arranged on your behalf by the West Lulworth House Manager.

By Car:

The recommended route is via Bere Regis and Wool – although slightly longer this avoids the traffic through Bournemouth and Poole. From Bere Regis follow signs to Wool. At Wool cross the level crossing and turn left following signs to Lulworth Cove and West Lulworth. Continue for a further 4 miles to Lulworth Cove. As you enter Lulworth Cove Village, there is a slip road on your left to West Lulworth House. Park on the slip road if you would like to take advantage of our bag drop off service, which is available from 10am to 6.30pm, on arrival and departure days. You can then continue to the public car park at the end of the slip road to park your car.

This car park is free for HF Holidays' guests as long as book your car in with House staff within 30 minutes of arriving, failure to do this could result in a fine from the Lulworth Estate.

Travelling From Overseas

If you're travelling from Europe the most convenient airport is at Southampton. From Southampton Airport Parkway station (adjacent to the airport terminal) there are direct trains every hour to Wool - journey time 1hr 20mins. See www.nationalrail.co.uk for details.

For most guests, travelling to either London Heathrow or London Gatwick airport is the best option. See

www.nationalrail.co.uk for onward connections by train to Wool.

Local Area

Lulworth Cove is a justifiably popular destination, with day-trippers and holiday-makers drawn by the stunning local scenery. The Cove itself is a near-perfect circle which has been carved by the soft rocks by the waves. A 20-minute walk along the cliff path will take you to Durdle Door, the area's other geological wonder. This impressive natural sea arch is developed in more resistant limestones. The free Heritage Centre next to the public car park is well worth a visit during your stay.

Facilities in Lulworth Cove are limited to a selection of pubs, cafés and souvenir shops. The nearest towns are Wareham, Dorchester and Weymouth, which all have a good selection of banks, chemists and supermarkets.

During your visit to Dorset you may enjoy visiting the following places of interest:

The Tank Museum

The Tank Museum at Bovington, 20 minutes' drive north of Lulworth Cove, houses a particularly impressive collection of tanks from around the world. Trace the history from the tank's origins in the First World War to the present day. www.tankmuseum.org

Lulworth Castle

Situated just a couple of miles inland from the cove, Lulworth Castle is a 17th century mock medieval castle that was once the heart of an extensive estate. Having been gutted by fire in 1929 it was derelict for many years, but has since been completely renovated. www.lulworth.com/castle

Corfe Castle

The iconic ruins of Corfe Castle stand guard over a natural gap in the Purbeck Hills, about 30 minutes' drive from Lulworth. Dating from the 11th century it is now maintained by the National Trust.

Swanage Railway

Ride on this lovingly restored branch line through the glorious Purbeck countryside. Steam hauled trains run throughout the year. You may want to leave your car in the Park & Ride at Norden, about 30 minutes' drive from Lulworth, and use the railway to visit the attractive seaside resort of Swanage.

Monkey World

Located near Wool, 20 minutes' drive north of Lulworth Cove, Monkey World is a great family attraction. Originally set up to rescue mistreated monkeys from overseas, it is now home to a huge collection of primates of all shapes and sizes. www.monkeyworld.org

Brownsea Island

Brownsea Island is located in the middle of Poole Harbour – boats depart from Poole Quay and Sandbanks, about 40 minutes' drive from Lulworth Cove. The island is now a nature reserve, managed by the National Trust and one of last remaining places to spot red squirrels in the UK. Brownsea is also famous as the location of the world's first scout camp in 1907. www.nationaltrust.org.uk/brownsea-island

Weymouth

Weymouth is a fine Regency seaside resort with an ever-popular beach and bustling harbour.

Thomas Hardy's Cottage

The writer Thomas Hardy was one of Dorset's most celebrated residents who used the local towns and villages around Dorchester as the setting for many of his novels. His birthplace near Dorchester is around 30 minutes' drive away and now owned by the National Trust. www.nationaltrust.org.uk/hardy-country

Athelhampton House & Gardens

Located near Dorchester, about 30 minutes' drive away, Athelhampton House is a fine Tudor building dating from 1485. The surrounding formal gardens are also impressive and were built between 1891 - 1899.

Kingston Lacy

This fine country house and estate is located near Wimborne Minster, about 45 minutes' drive from Lulworth Cove. Dating from 1665, and now managed by the National Trust, it houses a fine collection of antiques, with many notable examples from the Middle East and Egypt. www.nationaltrust.org.uk/kingston-lacy
